An Act to amend the Court Fees Act, 1870 (Act VII of 1870).

BE it enacted by the Delhi State Legislative Assembly in the Seventh Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be called the Court Fees (Delhi Amendment) Act, 1956. Short title and commencement.

(2) It shall come into force on the date it receives the assent of the President.

2. In Schedule II of the Court Fees Act, 1870, after entry 14, the following new entry and the proper fee against that shall be added, namely:— Amendment of Schedule II of the Court Fees Act, 1870.

Number	Proper fee
"14-A	Fifteen Rupees"
Every petition or application or memorandum of appeal under the Special Marriage Act, 1954 (43 of 1954) or the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 (25 of 1955).
